# A Chat About the West Gippsland Rail Towns Website

Q: We've been hearing a bit about the "West Gippsland Rail Towns" website lately. What is it, in plain English?

A: In simple terms, it's a new online home for our local towns — a place where residents, visitors, businesses and community groups can all find what's happening in Nar Nar Goon, Tynong, Garfield, Bunyip and the surrounding rail towns.

Each township now has its own dedicated website, as well as a shared regional site where everything comes together — events, local news, businesses, clubs, services and more.

Q: Why was there a need for something like this?

A: Over time, a lot of local information disappeared from the web — especially after the closure of some council-run "What's On" platforms. Small towns rely heavily on volunteers, and many Progress and Community Associations simply don't have the time or resources to build and maintain websites. So rather than each town struggling on its own, we thought: why not do this together?

Q: Who is behind the project? A: The project is being delivered by Garfield Community Website Inc., with generous support from Southside Racing and the Community Bank Bunyip & District. Importantly, it's a not-for-profit, community-led initiative — built by locals, for locals.

Q: What can people actually find on the site?

A: Quite a lot, actually! There are local business and trade listings, community and sporting clubs, seniors and community services, medical and emergency information, places of worship, and education providers.

There's also a free event calendar, and we host digital copies of local publications such as the Goon News, Tynong Tabloid, Garfield Spectator and Bunyip & District News — keeping our local stories accessible to everyone.

Q: And the town websites?

A: Each town now has its own site — NarNarGoonInfo.au, TynongInfo.au, Garfield.au and BunyipInfo.au — with more planned. Some have already been adopted by local Progress or Community Associations, and others are ready when the time is right.

Q: How can locals get involved?

A: Easy — visit [WGRT.au](http://WGRT.au). Businesses can list (with the first year free), groups can promote events, and community organisations can make sure their information is up to date. If you'd like to help your town adopt or grow its website, we'd love to hear from you.

Because at the end of the day, this project is about keeping our rail towns connected, visible and thriving — together.

# Award for Wombat Wellbeing

Congratulations to **Jen Mattingley** on being presented with a special award from the Akoonah Park Men's Shed, recognising her for her commitment to the wellbeing of wombats.

Jen and husband Reg spent many years in Tynong North / Maryknoll and were well known wombat carers, specialising in the treatment and care of mange in wombats.

They eventually moved away from the area to a smaller home and despite not having the companionship of wombats, were still heavily involved with their wellbeing. Until recently, Jen was a volunteer and director of the Wombat Protection Society. Fellow volunteer, Ali Martin said that Jen was instrumental in mange management and conservation during her time with the Society.

Several years ago, Jen received a grant from the State Government to support wombat conservation. Knowing that wombats are very determined creatures and would often burrow under fences to get to where they needed to go. she had an idea to create a gate that could easily be installed to fences by landowners.

When searching for an organisation to manufacture the gates, Jen heard from Jim Gills of the Akoonah Park Men's Shed and together with the help from the group and the society, they designed a gate that also incorporates an innovative capsule that activates when wombats use the gate, administering medication that treats mange. Starting in 2021, the project has created 604 gates that are now in use across farms, government sites and residential properties.

The men's shed went all out to create a custom award featuring a wombat and a gate, which was presented to Jen and Reg acknowledging their lifetime of care and conservation of wombats.

🚒 FIRE RESTRICTIONS CONTINUE TO BE IN FORCE 🚒

**During the Fire Danger Period, can I light a fire in the open air to burn off grass, stubble, weeds, scrub, undergrowth or other vegetation?**

🔥 **No**, unless:

- you have a Fire Danger Period permit issued by CFA, FRV or a Municipal Fire Prevention Officer, depending on the location of the activity
- you have a written permit issued by a Fire Prevention Officer of a public authority if planning to burn on land under their jurisdiction
- you comply with the conditions of that permit
- A person is in attendance at all times while the fire is alight and has the capacity and means to extinguish the fire
- The fire is completely extinguished before the person leaves.

Check with Cardinia Shire for any further restrictions specific to your property and location.

## Nar Nar Goon History Group

The Anderson Family: 'One Family's Journey with the Jersey Cow since 1886'

Presented by Winsome and her sons Lindsay & Ian on 23 February

Starting at the very beginning of the Anderson story, John and Margaret Anderson arrived in Melbourne on 2nd May, 1851. They created a small market garden and dairy farm at Caulfield. They arrived on a ship with very few belongings, which meant they did it hard, most likely living in a tent with very few facilities.

After the land boom of the 1880s, John bought 3 farms in the Lyndhurst area for his 3 sons – one farm each for William, Joseph and Richard. Lyndhurst is now known by a few different names including Cranbourne North, Hampton Park, Lynbrook and Narre Warren South. Joseph established the “Kings Vale” Jersey Stud at Lyndhurst from 1886 to 1937 when he died. The farm then passed onto his son John Sime who continued to carry on the farm until 1947. John Sime’s 2 sons, John Charles and Bert Richard (Winsome’s late husband) nurtured the herd and were the most successful exhibitors at the Melbourne Royal Agricultural show 9 times in the following 10 years after the war. Bert had the record of exhibiting for 41 years consecutively at the Royal Melbourne Show.

In 1961, the brothers dissolved the partnership, split the property and the herd, pick for pick. John, known as Jock, retained the original site and the “Kings Vale” prefix while Bert and Winsome developed the Hallam Road side “New Everything” and chose the “Kings View” prefix. Bert passed away in 1987 and Jock passed away in 1988. The brother in the middle passed away a week after Winsome’s husband Bert died in 1987. Very sadly, the Anderson family lost 3 of their own over 2 years.

After Jock passed away in 1988, “Kings Vale” was managed by his son David at Ripplebrook, until 2019 when he retired from farming and dispersed the herd. Lindsay established “Kings Vista” at Athlone in 1989. Lindsay and his wife Jacinta’s son Patrick has “Kings Veldt” Jersey Stud. Their daughter Melissa has established “Westella” Jerseys. Melissa’s son Austin, who is nearly 11 has his own Jersey Stud “King Starella”. Ian retained “Kings View” prefix at Nar Nar Goon where he still is today. He moved to Nar Nar Goon in 1989, with his brother Robert, to the property known as the Reich farm. They farmed in partnership until the year 2000 when Robert bought a farm and moved to Drouin West and carried on his “Kings Ville”. Robert has been awarded champions at IDW (International Dairy week) and has accepted international judging appointments. He is a very successful breeder of many bulls in AI (Artificial Insemination).

Robert with his wife Kerrie own “Kings Ville” stud, which was established in 1986, now based at Drouin West. Their daughter Holly has “Empire” Jersey stud also at Drouin West. She made headlines in the Pakenham Gazette as the youngest breeder of a bull in AI. Ian explained that their journey as a family has always revolved around the Jersey cow. He still has descendants DNA of early Jerseys in his herd today.

It’s one of Ian’s proudest successes today that the Anderson family has been able to establish cow families and continue them on for multiple generations. These cow families have been going for 35 generations. He is so passionate he could recognize the last 10 generations of his cows. At the age of 10, Ian could remember cows and where they belonged in the Jersey family. All the cows had an official name and a number and they also had nicknames for them. The cow in the Western Star butter advert was known to Winsome as Eulalie because her mother was reserve champion, Melbourne and she was known as Eunice, so you had to think of something starting with or sounded like U. Ian said that the Anderson family starting exhibiting at the Royal Melbourne Show in 1896. For every Melbourne show there ever was, (excluding War years when there were no shows) there was always an Anderson exhibiting Jerseys. In Winsome’s Museum is the President’s Medal awarded to the family in 1996, their Centenary year of showing at the RAS (Royal Agricultural Show).
