Tynong Progress Association President's Report

AGM Wednesday 13 May 2026 (Held at the former Infant Welfare Centre)

Welcome everyone to our first AGM in our own Community Room, I hope we will share many more here.

It hasn't been a full 12 months since our last AGM but at least we are nearer to our scheduled dates. It has been a very busy time, culminating in a very different ANZAC day service on 25th April. We were fortunate to have a catafalque ('cat-a-falk') party consisting of cadets from HMAS CERBERUS with Commander John de Bomford as our special guest speaker.

Just in time for the service, we received funding from the Minister for Veterans' Affairs 2025-26 "Saluting Their Service" Commemorative Grants Program, which enabled us to purchase and erect two new flagpoles and refresh the surrounding vegetation at our memorial. This was done with the supervision and help of Peter Hams who was actively involved in the design of the memorial when it was upgraded many years ago. So, a big thank you to Peter and all the others that helped with this upgrade.

I'd like to acknowledge the passing of Elva Hamill in September, just a few months short of her 100th birthday. Elva spent most of her married life in Tynong and was a well-loved and popular lady. She was the Secretary of the Association for many years until the early 1990s but maintained her interest in the group until she moved from Tynong. Elva was also an active member of the Tynong Hall Committee and Tennis Club, as well as the Make A Wish Group and Nar Nar Goon RSL. Because she was a long-time member of the Pakenham Racing Club, a memorial service was held there and was attended by well over 100 people. She is missed greatly and fondly remembered.

We held nine meetings this year and had a very enjoyable meeting at the Garfield Pub for a get together in October. We have been lucky to have a few visits from Bunyip Ward councillor, Alanna Pomeroy who makes herself readily available to help us with advice on fundraising and local matters. John Henderson has been our guest for a couple of meetings to tell us about the progress of the West Gippsland Rail Towns web page which will provide all our towns with a much-needed information source. We also had our local MP Wayne Farnham visit with a gift of two new flags for our flagpoles. Wayne was interested in hearing about our issues but was not able to tell us if there had been any development on the fate of the Princes Highway Petition.

We did prepare for another Clean Up Australia Day this year, but due to illnesses and bad weather, it didn't eventuate. We might try again later in the year. There have been the usual issues to chase up – potholes, streetlights and drainage and thankfully the very big potholes at the intersection of Tynong Road and the Princes Highway were fixed.

We received funding last year to erect a garden shed in the grounds of this community centre but have been hampered by red tape and maternity leave of council officers. However, we should be able to see this project finish in the next month or two.

Towards the end of last year, we asked for community suggestions for a name for our centre and after selecting the most popular names and voting on the preferred one, we are waiting on Council once again to accept the name.

Progress on the renovations to this building is still in the pipeline as we need to do some serious fundraising to help with the works. However, it was decided that it was time to use the building and hold our meetings here. The newsletter printer is still housed at the Tynong Fire Station until we can arrange to have internet access. We have been very fortunate to have been able to share the Brigade's meeting room since they moved into their new building and for that, we are extremely thankful.

Tynong Christmas was a big deal again this year with heaps more Christmas trees prepared and given to local families to display at their homes. Many thanks to Stuart Chandler and Noah Van Der Veer for their time in making the trees and being the judges of the best decorated tree.

Once again, our town Christmas party was a big hit. As well as our usual activities, we hired a jumping castle for the kids and organised a visit from Santa and the Tynong CFA Fire Truck. We had face painting and an animal petting farm too. The Playgroup littlies entertained us with a mini concert which had everyone beaming. Bunyip Garfield Rotary helped us out by manning the bbq and the whole community helped by buying raffle tickets for our monster raffle, with the proceeds used to cover costs on the night.

Plenty of other thanks are in order too – Janet for agreeing to take on the role as Secretary last year and for ably keeping us on track and informed and meeting ready; Denise for continuing to provide exact and detailed treasurer's reports and keeping us financially sound, and also with Janet, working together on grant applications; Josh for once again in your dual role as Vice President and Meeting Minutes Secretary and our go-to person for electronic information; Caroline for providing us with a top notch local newsletter (the best in the area!) especially with the new-look issue this year.

And thank you all for your support, contributions, attending meetings and for being part of the Tynong Progress Association.

Big Turnout for ANZAC Day Service at Tynong

Beautiful weather saw a large crowd of locals gather at the Cenotaph in Tynong for the ANZAC Day Service to honour the service and ultimate sacrifice of members of our armed forces. And to also recognize and pay tribute to the service of our armed forces in current times with conflict and peacekeeping roles.

Tynong Fire Brigade Captain David Glazzard was the MC for the service and welcomed the guests. The service was organized by the Tynong Progress Association who welcomed the Catafalque Party from HMAS Cerberus to the Cenotaph to preside over the service.

Councillor Alana Pomeroy dedicated the acknowledgment of country. A fitting poem, The Anzacs' Flame, was read by Nar Nar Goon RSL representative Terrence Reeves. Prayers and Gospel readings were read by Mrs Gladys Quigley, and Mr David Williams, Vice Principal of St Thomas Aquinus School. A very moving Commemorative Address was given by the guest speaker, Commander John de Bomford from HMAS Cerberus.

Following the speakers, Wreaths were laid by several members of the local community groups, including Commander and Mrs John de Bomford HMAS Cerberus, St Thomas Aquinus School, Tynong CFA, The Progress Association, The Hall Committee and Recreation Reserve Committee, NNG RSL, Bunyip Branch Bendigo Bank and Councillor Alana Pomeroy. The Ode was read followed by playing of The Last Post. Completing the service was the Australian and New Zealand National Anthems.

Morning tea followed the service where the community continued to mingle and chat in the glorious sunshine.

Cardinia Shire Council has endorsed the Local Street Sealing Initiative (LSSI), establishing a consistent framework to guide how unsealed residential roads may be considered for future upgrades.

The Local Street Sealing Initiative (LSSI) outlines Council's long-term, strategic and sustainable approach to improving unsealed residential roads across the shire in a fair, transparent, and affordable way.

Previously, requests to seal roads were considered on a case-by-case basis. The LSSI changes this by setting out how unsealed residential roads may be assessed, considered, and progressively proposed for engagement as part of a Special Charge Scheme over time.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Brett Owen said this new initiative aligns with Council's commitment to improving unsealed roads, which is a key priority in the Council Plan. 'We know unsealed roads can be frustrating for residents, whether it's dust, rough surfaces, drainage issues, or access during bad weather. Our communities want to see real progress. This initiative gives us a clear, consistent, and transparent way to start addressing those challenges over time. Our Local Street Sealing Initiative provides a responsible and sustainable way to improve local streets, ensuring money is spent wisely and communities are involved in decisions. The LSSI enables more roads to be considered for sealing over time through a Special Charge Scheme for the benefit of residents and the wider municipality,' Mayor Owen said.

The initiative sets out clear and transparent assessment criteria to help guide decision-making in a fair and consistent way. These include:

- affordability and estimated costs for property owners
- ongoing maintenance demands and asset management costs
- safety and emergency access
- resident enquiries and demonstrated community interest

Community engagement is an essential element of the LSSI framework. Council is proposing to engage with property owners to progress future road sealing projects through Special Charge Schemes. A Special Charge Scheme (SCS) is a legislated way for Council and benefiting property owners to share the cost of local road upgrades.

A staged consultation process has been mapped out as part of the LSSI, in line with the Local Government Act and Council's Special Charge Scheme policy, to empower property owners and Council to progress together.

Property owners will be informed and engaged at key stages, through information sessions and surveys. Property owner feedback will be a key factor in determining whether a road is recommended to proceed through the statutory SCS process or not.

More than 170 unsealed residential streets are currently eligible for consideration under the LSSI. Inclusion in the initiative does not guarantee an upgrade, however it means a street may be considered for future planning and community consultation. Under the LSSI, residents also have the option to submit a formal petition to Council, demonstrating majority property owner support for their road to be considered for a potential Special Charge Scheme.

With Council currently managing over 800km of unsealed roads across Cardinia Shire, the LSSI has been developed to help respond to the growing demands, challenges, and pressures of maintaining and trying to upgrade the unsealed road network.

Council continues to advocate for funding for unsealed road upgrades ahead of the upcoming State election. To date, no additional funding has been secured.

The Local Street Sealing Initiative won't solve every issue overnight, but it provides a clear, responsible path forward that balances fairness, affordability and transparency, while helping us improve local roads for our residents over time,' Mayor Owen said.

Council is currently in the process of updating its Special Charge Policy to provide further clarity about its process. More information is expected to be shared later this year.

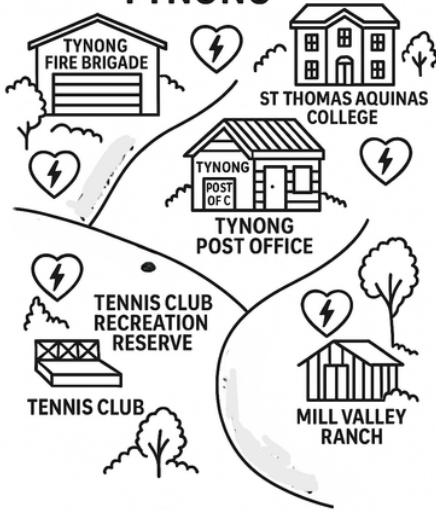
