

Now the cooler weather is here, it will be a good time to explore your local environment.

The Friends of Kirth Kiln have put together a book "Walking for Pleasure" in Kirth Kiln Regional Park. The Park is situated on 3500 hectares, west of the Bunyip State Park.

The book contains over 100 walking tracks in the Kirth Kiln Regional Park, with a history of the early settlers in the area who carved out a living in the bush. It also tells you of the distance and grade of the different walks within the Park itself.

Kurth Kiln Regional Park is located 65 kilometres east of Melbourne, and is mostly known for its kiln, used during the Second World War to make charcoal for gas producer units fitted to motor cars. Today, the park is popular for picnicking, camping, nature walking and horse riding.

The book is available to order from the Tynong Post Office - (0356292488) and will cost \$10 as a donation to the Friends of the Kirth Kiln.

Here is an extract relating to the one of the tracks that you will find in the book. There is detailed information in the book of what you will expect to find if you decide to take this track, complete with photos.

Five Sections in Kurth Kiln Regional Park

Note: the filled-in black X symbols on these maps indicate the location of gates, fitted usually at the entrance to tracks, to allow seasonal closure and prevent unauthorised vehicles damaging the soft surface of the tracks.

The gates can be opened to provide access to emergency vehicles






The trains are back!

After a long five weeks without our beloved V-line trains, due to upgrades on the Gippsland line (including duplication of the tracks between Bunyip and Longwarry), combined with finishing up the new Pakenham East and Pakenham stations and skyrail—the trains are back! Six days earlier than planned, however with a slightly adjusted timetable—check the V-line or PTV apps and websites for details.

For those who want to venture onto the metro line, it's crept closer to the neighbourhood with the new Pakenham East station opening at the start of June. This station is an extension of the existing Pakenham line and brings the metropolitan line a couple of kilometres closer to Tynong.

Recent Brigade Activities

On Monday 30 April a well-attended social night was held at the fire station for members and their families.

The Tynong Fire Brigade Support Team

Perhaps some people in Tynong and surrounds may not aware that the Tynong Fire Brigade has a Support Team (previously known as the Auxiliary). If you have wondered how you could contribute to the Brigade and the community and don't wish to be a fire fighter, joining the Support Team is an ideal way to do so. The Support Team consists of women and men with ages ranging from late teens to retirees. Support team members are full members of the Tynong Fire Brigade and the CFA.

Duties of the Support Team are as follows:

- Fund raising (sausage sizzles on election days, providing car parking directions at the race course are two examples).
- Gardening working bees.
- Catering when required.
- Participating in a roster for cleaning the fire station.
- Organising and supporting brigade events such as family socials, the annual dinner, the family fun day, ANZAC Day set up, Christmas Santa photo days.
- Attending monthly support team and brigade meetings.
- Keeping call out numbers up to date on the front notice board at the fire station and;
- Other duties as required.

Support team members who wish to do so can do the training and become a fire fighter. Three of our women Support Team-members have achieved this over the past few years. A number of support team members have also become trained first aiders.
