




Last month 20 members enjoyed Graeme Moore's stories about his family life and finding a property to settle in NNG about 40 years ago. He also shared stories of his service to our community as a Shire Councillor for 14 years. He's a man of many talents and finished with a guitar recital - a skill he developed in his time at school.

Graeme noted that to be a Councillor you needed to be a showman and a salesman. Today's presentation supported that he does have both these skill sets.

Many thanks to Graeme for a very entertaining presentation and for his 14 years of service as a Shire of Cardinia Councillor for our community. Thanks to our Mayor Cr Jack Kowarzik for coming along to support Graeme and formally thank him in this forum for his great service as a Councillor for so many years.

New faces to our group today included Winsome Anderson and Les Francis. Welcome to you both. Les has purchased a house at 19 Station Street in NNG and has enjoyed researching the history of the property, which was built in 1948. He has certainly chosen to live in a NNG street with history where Gilmartins and in turn Gary McGrath had the local store and where the famous explosion of the NNG pub happened in the early 1970s.

The passing of Jimmy Dore in recent weeks was acknowledged today. The article about Jimmy in the Pakenham Gazette this week was an interesting summary of Jimmy's enormous contribution he made to football in general but more particularly to NNG Football club where he played in a winning Seniors grand final at age 16 in 1960 and another winning grand final in 1965. He coached many clubs over the years but notable are when he coached NNG in 1979 and 1980, making the grand final in both years and winning in 1980. Thoughts are with all the Dore family and particularly Geoff, his brother who is a member of our NNG History group.

Don't forget the October 25th NNG History group bus tour of the KWR swamp. Starts from NNG recreation reserve at 9.30am, returning at 1.30PM. I'll contact you all early October to get your interest in booking for the trip. NNG Progress Association has subsidised the bus. Cost is \$15pp which includes morning tea. The general public will be offered any spare seats. They will be advertised through this Newsletter in October.



## Bunyip Women Working with Wood | Roman Kulkewycz

I can hear the sounds of saws, drills and lathes as I approach the Bunyip Women's Shed. Once I arrive I see a hive of activity before me. There are women creating and repairing furniture using a range of professional woodworking tools. These ladies are part of the fourteen members of the Bunyip & District Women's Shed.

Judy Papp from Garfield North, a professional carpenter is the Shed supervisor and trainer. The Women's Shed was opened in July 2023 as the need for such a facility to provide a safe and well managed place was identified and it is currently in the development stages. " We are here every Friday between 9.00am – 12.00noon. Women between the ages of 18 – 68 come along to learn new carpentry skills, enjoy social interaction and build community connections, said Judy. " There is nowhere nearby like this facility to learn, socialise and contribute to this community" she added.

'Our vision for the future is to increase our numbers, introduce welding courses, cooking classes and all forms of metalwork.' said Judy



## Want to know how to stay fire safe with rechargeable batteries? Read on...! (Sourced from [CFA.vic.gov.au](https://www.cfa.vic.gov.au))

Many portable devices today are powered by rechargeable lithium-ion batteries. These types of batteries pose a higher risk of fire than others.

Lithium-ion batteries are popular because they are light-weight and long lasting compared to other rechargeable batteries.

You will find them in many devices such as phones, tablets, power banks, laptop computers, toys, appliances and tools, as well as mobility equipment such as e-bikes and e-scooters. They can also be found in many other modern devices that need power.

### What causes lithium-ion batteries to catch fire?

Lithium-ion batteries release toxic and flammable gases when they short circuit, which may lead to them catching fire. If the battery is fully charged, violent fire behaviour with sparks and jet-like flames may be experienced.

The main reasons lithium-ion batteries short circuit and catch fire - a process called thermal runaway - are because they:

- Are incorrectly charged using a charging cable that was not designed for the device or battery. This can result in overcharging or overheating.
- Have been damaged by an impact, cracked, dented, punctured, crushed or exposed to overheating.
- Have been in fresh or salt water for a long time, causing corrosion within the battery.

### How can I prevent my batteries or devices from catching fire?

- Use the correct charger
- Ensure the battery and charger is suited for the job and has no electrical faults.
- Only use chargers that are supplied with the equipment or device, or certified third-party charging equipment that is compatible with the battery specifications.
- Only purchase and use devices and equipment from reputable manufacturers and suppliers.
- Always follow the manufacturers' charging and operation instructions.
- Disconnect a device or battery once it indicates that it is fully charged.
- Only use chargers that meet Australian Standards - look for the Regulatory Compliance Mark.
- Don't help your devices to overheat—Devices left on soft surfaces like beds and couches can overheat and catch fire. Don't charge batteries or devices on soft surfaces such as beds, couches and carpet.
- Keep batteries and devices away from items that can easily catch fire like blankets, clothing and paper.
- Never charge a device under a pillow.
- Don't leave charging devices unattended. There is a higher risk from fire if you are not in attendance or sleeping while devices are charging
- Avoid charging batteries or devices overnight.

### General charging safety

- Only plug in one device per outlet, and always keep power boards and cables neat and tidy.
- Don't use battery charging devices with worn or damaged cables.
- Always ensure the battery charger is switched off from the electrical power supply before connecting the batteries. This will minimize the risk of shock and sparking while connecting the batteries.
- Lithium-ion batteries can be sensitive to heat and therefore must be charged and stored in moderate temperatures.
- Never store or leave batteries and devices in areas where they can be exposed to heat or moisture.
- Do not leave devices such as phones, computers or charging devices in direct sunlight or in parked vehicles where they can quickly heat up.
- Larger batteries and equipment such as power tools and especially electric bikes, scooters or skateboards should be charged in the garage, shed or carport away from living spaces.
- Victorian fire services recommend that interconnected smoke alarms are installed in areas where devices are often charged.
