





Welcome to the new year! The Progress Association has hit the ground running with the creation of a petition to be tabled in Parliament in March this year.

There have been many calls to do something about the intersection of Tynong and Tynong North roads, especially with the number of trucks entering and exiting the quarry on Tynong North Road. We realise that to try and expect a solution just for this intersection would be just about impossible so we decided to go all out and ask the State Government to create a masterplan to upgrade all of the Highway from Nar Nar Goon to beyond Bunyip.

The petition has been created with the help of our local member of Parliament, Wayne Farnham, who will present the petition to the State Government when it is due on March 10th 2025.

There are also paper petitions at the Tynong Post Office and the Granite Café and several local businesses.

To date we have an approximate total of 2,100 signatures!



Vale John Reginald Sinclair

19/7/1925 - 20/12/2024

Dad was born in Lilydale, the second eldest of 6 children. He grew up in Murrumbeena.

Dad started his working life with his father William Sinclair, carting milk from Traralgon to dairies in and around the city, and in 1949 is father bought a bus business on North Rd Murrumbeena.

Dad and his brothers worked in the business, and when his father retired Dad become the director of Sinclair's Coaches in Murrumbeena. Dad also owned other bus companies in Victoria and interstate, including Trailways in Alice Springs, Matilda Tours in Darwin and a branch of Pioneer.

During this time, we lived in Holm Park Rd in Beaconsfield, and in 1972 my parents, John and Lee Sinclair, purchased approx. 30 acres of bare land at 720 Tynong North Rd.

As a family we would spend many weekends there, swimming in the dam or riding our ponies, whilst mum and dad would put up fences and start to have infrastructure built.

The house was built in 1981, and although my parents were divorced by now, Dad would still spend many weekends at the farm, helping mum with the heavier chores.

In 1997 Dad moved in permanently to help look after Mum when she was diagnosed with terminal cancer. Mum passed away in 1998, and Dad remained living on the farm.

With failing eyesight, Dad would often catch the train from Tynong to meet up with friends in the city. Dad loved a chat, and would talk to many locals on the train. I'm sure he knew more about the area than we did.

Dad lived at 720 by himself until the fires in 2019. During the fires we insisted Dad move in with us next door, at 670 Tynong North Road. Dad continued living with us until his passing just before Christmas 2024.

Dad was the ultimate gentleman, and is missed by many, especially me.
