



Tynong Fire Brigade News

In case of emergency, ring 000



Just a word from your local fire brigade prior to summer,

Firstly in an emergency can we find you?

A clear and easy to find property number both in daylight and at night is essential for emergency services to find your property quickly.

Next, are we able to access your driveway? A fire truck is over 3m wide and over 3m high and if you have a private bridge over a drain or creek is it in good condition (even if you think that a bridge is able to take 13t. Our drivers will inspect a bridge before crossing and if there is any doubt in their minds about the safety of a crossing they will not cross.)

Are your private power poles and all their connections in good order and trees well clear of the conductors?


Now is the time to clean up around your property and we all know that on larger properties this will mean at least one burn-off to get rid of all those fallen branches and other garden waste.

If you intend to carry out a burn-off


- 1) Ensure that you check both the Cardinia Shire Council and the Country Fire Authorities web sites for restrictions permit requirements etc.
- 2) Check weather forecast for the day you intend to light the fire and the following few days.
- 3) Make sure that you have fire fighting equipment on hand and you are capable of using it. And that the area around your burn is clear.
- 4) Register your burn with ESTA on 1800 668 511 and inform your neighbours.
- 5) Do Not burn plastics, tyres or other, material.
- 6) Never leave a burn off unattended.

Reunited with Mum

Peter was born in Poland, in the town of Brody, near the Ukraine border. In 1947, Brody was the scene of one of the biggest battles with Germany during WW2 and Peter's father, Michael was killed after being run over by a tank.

With the uncertainty of the future in Poland after the war, Peter's mother, Maria obtained passage to Australia for herself and

her 3 young boys, Michael, Larry and Peter. They arrived in Australia in 1947 and initially lived at the Maribyrnong Migrant Hostel. Maria worked very hard to make a life for her 3 boys and eventually brought a house in Braybrook. The boys went to a local Catholic school and were taught by the nuns, who were very strict. As the boys did not speak very good English, they were often given the job of splitting wood. Needless to say, Peter didn't stay too long at school. He left at the end of his primary schooling and managed to find work with a friend at the local council, fixing and driving trucks and general odd jobs.

His passion for cars grew in his teenage years as he and his brothers always had cars around, driving, fixing and repairing them. There was always parties and girls in those days and it was during this time that Peter and Lyn met and fell in love.

Peter and Lyn began their married life in a flat in Braybrook, where Cindy was born in 1965, then Karen in 1966. They brought a 3 bedroomed house in Elanora Road, Noble Park where they welcomed the rest of the children, Cheryl, Donna and John.

Peter began to work on cars for a living here. He completed courses in panel beating and spray painting to work on cars from home. Both he and Lyn worked very hard to provide a home for their family, with Peter driving for the local abattoirs in the early morning and coming home to work on cars for the rest of the day. They began saving to buy acreage, firstly looking at Pakenham Upper before finding 25 acres in Tynong.

Peter and Lynn were determined to build their own house so Peter went to TAFE to learn bricklaying. They spent many weekends living in a caravan before finally selling the home in Noble Park and moving into their new house in Tynong. Peter built a huge shed for car repairs and began a new business - Pakenham Wreckers, which he ran until he retired.

Daughter Cindy moved back with Mum and Dad to help look after them during Mum's illness. Lynne passed away in 2015. Peter still lived at home in Tynong with the love and care of Cindy right up until his final weeks when passed away at Dandenong Hospital after a short illness.




