Cardinia Shire Council's draft Reconciliation Action Plan now open for public exhibition

Cardinia Shire Council is inviting community members to review the draft Innovate Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) 2025–2027 that aims to further strengthen reconciliation across the Shire.

Earlier this year, Council began developing its third RAP in consultation with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community members, Traditional Owners, the broader community and Council's internal Reconciliation Working Group.

The draft RAP outlines actions to build and strengthen relationships, show respect and create improved opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Cardinia Shire Council Deputy Mayor, Cr Liz Roberts said the RAP represents an important step in continuing the journey of reconciliation.

“Thank you to all community members who engaged with us earlier this year during the development of the RAP”.

“Our third RAP builds on the progress we've made and reaffirms our commitment to reconciliation and strengthening relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across the Shire. We encourage our community to review the draft plan and share their feedback” she says.

The draft RAP is now available for public exhibition until Monday 19 January 2026.

The finalised, designed RAP will be presented to Council in early 2026.

Defibrillator Available All Hours in Tynong

There is a 24-hour accessible defibrillator box outside the Tynong Post Office and Granite Café on Railway Avenue, Tynong.

Up until recently the defib was only available during business hours but thanks to a sponsorship grant from the Fulton Hogan Quarry in Tynong North, a secure box has been purchased to house the defib.

Also acknowledging the support of Willarn Building Services, the Granite Café and Tynong LPO in placing the box. where it can be seen in an emergency.

The defibrillator was purchased by the Tynong Progress Association who are also responsible for the upkeep of the defib, as a service to Tynong residents.







Denis Doherty Presentation 15/12

Over 50 people enjoyed Denis Doherty's recount of life in the Doherty household. His parents Dot (McGrath) and Bill lived very busy lives. Dot kept the home fires burning bringing up 6 kids and Bill was a great Dad who was the financial bread winner for the family. Bill's ability, interest and commitment to the family first, followed by the community was beyond expectation. In fact his outstanding service to sport and the community was acknowledged by being awarded the Order of Australia (OAM) medal in 2021.

It's a great family story which was honoured by the presence today by most of the immediate Doherty family and some of their off spring. Yesterday they coincidentally held a Doherty family reunion. Faye Doherty surprised them all by flying down from Coomera in QLD with her family for the day. Unfortunately Faye lost her husband Terry in April this year.

Following the talk, the floor was opened up for input from the audience. It was so heartwarming

to hear from people like Fran who is married to Michael Doherty, confirming the welcome and warmth Dot and Bill offered to her when she came into the family. This was confirmed by other comments made by immediate and extended family members. Bert Kooloos and Brian Arnold both talked about visiting the Doherty household - a home away from home in which they loved being involved.

We need more family stories to be told in 2026! If you know of any NNG families with a NNG history, encourage them to come forward and offer to share the history with our group. There will be a book published eventually with all the stories, so each family who presents will be in the book. This equates to officially being part of the history and fabric of Nar Nar Goon in the printed format.

Geoff Bramley offered to contact Neil Fortune to start the ball rolling on collecting stories about the history of NNG families.

Fast forward to now, our group has grown to nearly 100 on the mailing list. Donna Handley (Byrne) has summed up this group beautifully- it's brought a whole community together.

Hi, I am **Andrew**, one of the new faces behind Tynong's Granite Café.

I grew up in South Gippsland on a small farm and attended Koo Wee Rup Secondary School.

We've spent the last few months settling in to Berwick after moving from Tonimbuk, where I farmed beef cattle for 25 years. (Yes, 25 years... I'm still waking up at farm hours, so if you see me here before sunrise, that's why.) Somewhere in amongst everything I acquired the Bottom Pub in Bunyip and renovated it into the renowned country pub it is today.


